

Setting the Stage: Justice40




40% of benefits from Federal investments in climate and clean energy flow to **disadvantaged communities** most impacted by climate change and pollution

First: define the "who"


Convene communities to cocreate a definition that reflects their lived experiences

Define **who** you aim to serve.

Collect data to create a foundation to define priority populations




Next: Clarify 'Equity' and Articulate Goals

Define **what** "equity" means.

Seek community input to understand the perspectives of communities. Align goals with existing equity mandates at the state or federal level

Identify barriers to environmental and energy justice

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Finally: Drive Equity and Measure Progress

Define what success looks like for each tactic (and how to measure it)

Create measurable, incremental tactics to advance equity. Assess – and reassess – tactics to measure progress toward advancing equity

Case study: Connecticut EEB



Distributive

Relates to the **distribution of benefits and costs** and calls for directing resources to the most vulnerable communities.



Contextual

Recognizes the legacy of racial and income equality, among other factors, in the development of policy.

Procedural

Relates to **planning processes** and calls for open, accessible planning processes in partnership with low-income communities and communities of color.



Corrective

Recognizes that the most vulnerable communities often lack traditional forms of economic resources or political influence and calls for a process by which communities can **hold institutions accountable**.
